Dear Regent and Waldschmidt House Chairman:

Many chapters have not informed themselves concerning this wonderful old stone house in Southwestern Ohio. It is visited by many from other states as well as our own and reflects in the native field stone with white mortar and heavy oak timbers, the energy and perserverance of the men and women who came to Ohio to make their homes.

This is the home of generations of one family, beginning with Christian Waldschmidt who purchased the land in 1794. They occupied the home until the period of the Civil War, when it became the headquarters of Gen. Joshua Bates, commandant of Camp Dennison. At this time, it left the ownership of the family, and gradually fell into disrepair, until it was given to the Ohio Society, Daughters of the American Revolution in 1941.

Restoring of the structure, furnishing and operating the house has been accomplished by the D.A.R. and it has become a public memorial for all to view.

The house is open to the public without charge, although donations are gratefully accepted. That these are not sufficient for the operation of the house is readily understood, and we believe it is the privilege of each and every Chapter in Ohio to have the opportunity of sharing in the ownership of this splendid memorial and to give it the support needed to keep it the fine public memorial it has become.

Dear DAR Chapter:

Gifts for Waldschmidt House are sought and treasured, and because the Christian Waldschmidt House is a Museum home and not a collection museum, it is necessary to curtail our acceptance of gifts. Not because we do not appreciate your motive in offering them but because there is not enough room for anything except what pertains to the home and the period. (Prior to 1830, except for articles pertaining to the Civil War and Camp Dennison.)

This is a furnished home. There is no storage area. There are no closets. Our articles of housekeeping are kept in available hiding places (the brooms and mops under the cellar stairway).

It was necessary some time ago, to set up certain rules in our By-Laws, for the protection of donors, so that their gifts would not be lost in the acceptance.

Sec. 12 - ALL ITEMS OFFERED TO THE WALDSCHMIDT HOUSE TO BE EXAMINED AND EVALUATED AS TO AUTHENTICITY AND ACCEPTABILITY BEFORE BEING RECEIVED. THE SERVICES OF A COMPETENT PERSON, NOT A MEMBER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, SHALL BE RETAINED ON A VOLUNTEER BASIS TO ASSIST IN JUDGING ARTICLES OFFERED.

As any homemaker will recognize, this is not an edict of discrimination but a necessary rule to keep from adding items of great value to a Museum, but not suitable for Waldschmidt House.

We hope you will understand our position and not be hurt if your gifts are not accepted for Waldschmidt House. If you wish, we shall be glad to see that they are placed in a proper Museum, or disposed of at your request. But it would be better if you first let us know of your intention of making a gift to the House, and we can give you the necessary information.

Please retain this letter and the enclosed form. It will assist you if you have an inquiry later on. Additional forms are available at your request.
