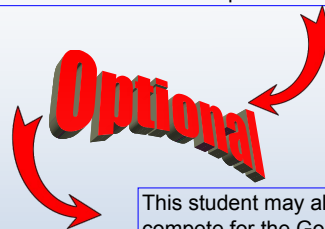

Award

A High School selects one senior to be their Good Citizen and your chapter presents her or him with a certificate and pin.



Scholarship

This student may also choose to submit a portfolio to compete for the Good Citizens Scholarship. The state winner receives \$500 and national winners (one male and one female) each receive a \$5000 scholarship and additional awards in Washington D.C.

DAR Good Citizens

The DAR Good Citizens Award and Scholarship Contest, created in 1934, is intended to encourage and reward the qualities of good citizenship.

This award recognizes and rewards individuals who possess the qualities of dependability, service, leadership, and patriotism in their homes, schools, and communities. These students are selected by their teachers and peers because they demonstrate these qualities to an outstanding degree.

This program is only open to high-school seniors whose schools are accredited by their state board of education.

Only one student per year may be honored as a school's DAR Good Citizen.

Once a student is chosen as the DAR Good Citizen, she or he is invited to participate in the scholarship portion of the program. This consists of assembling a personal statement, a high school transcript, recommendations, and an essay. Student participation in the scholarship portion of the program is optional.
